GAUDENZIA'S SERVICES IN MARYLAND:

- In 2001, Gaudenzia was invited to Maryland by political leaders and local foundations to provide much needed addiction treatment services to the city of Baltimore.
 - Gaudenzia operates 18 community-based programs at six facilities in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County.
 - Services for adult men and women include: detoxification, short-term and long-term residential treatment, outpatient treatment, halfway house services and weekend DWI interventions. In addition, specialized residential services for individuals with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders, as well as for pregnant/parenting women and their children are offered.
 - Gaudenzia has entered into a management agreement with RAP, Inc., a provider of substance use and mental health, residential and outpatient services, HIV/AIDS care, emergency housing, and primary medical care in Washington, D.C.
 - In response to the opioid crisis, Gaudenzia offers on-demand treatment to individuals struggling with opioid use disorder through our Baltimore Crisis Services Unit.

ABOUT GAUDENZIA:

In 1968 in Philadelphia, a group of business, political, and community leaders, as well as people in recovery from drug and alcohol use, recognized a serious problem: a growing number of people affected by addiction were unable to find help. Gaudenzia was founded to help meet this need. Since then, it is estimated that Gaudenzia has admitted into treatment over 250,000 individuals.

Gaudenzia began as a single facility. Today we operate 180 programs at 105 facilities throughout Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware and Washington DC. Now serving about 19,791 individuals annually, Gaudenzia helps individuals and families affected by drug and alcohol dependency, mental illness and related conditions to achieve a better quality of life and become accountable individuals.

Gaudenzia continues to improve and expand our services, helping individuals and their loved ones overcome the ravages of addiction to drugs and alcohol.
